





GUIDANCE




7TH GRADE SCIENCE

IMPORTANT TIMES/RULES TO REMEMBER IN 2022-2023...

Each school day officially at 7:15am in the classroom (students are tardy if they arrive after this time). If your child is late, a parent must sign them in at the office.

Each school day officially ends at 2:45pm. Students that leave early do lose attendance time. All parts of the school day are important!

Attendance/Truancy: The Bellefontaine City Schools Attendance Policy recognizes the importance of good attendance habits. It is important for you to communicate to the school if your child is out of school for any reason. Notification is required the morning of each absence to inform the school that the student will not be attending that day. Should proper notification not be received, the school will notify the parent or guardian of the student's absence within 120 minutes of the start of the school day. Each absence will be recorded as truant until a signed written note by the parent/guardian or a medical note from a doctor stating the reason for the absence is received. A maximum of 10 parent notes for each student will be accepted. Days will be considered truant thereafter without a medical note. An absence may be changed to excused when a note is received within 24 hours for one of the following legitimate reasons:

Personal illness (a written physician's statement verifying the illness may be required) Illness in the family necessitating the presence of the child Quarantine of the home

Death in the family

Observation or celebration of a bona fide religious holiday

Such good cause as may be acceptable to the Superintendent

A student will be considered habitually truant if the student is absent without a legitimate excuse for five (5) consecutive days (30 hours), seven (7) days in one school month (42 hours), or twelve (12) days in one school year (72 hours). When a student is excessively absent and accumulates thirty-eight (38) or more hours per month, or sixty-five (65) or more hours per school year, with or without a legitimate excuse, we are required to involve parents with the hope for improvement. Notification and communication may be in the form of a letter, phone call, or a scheduled absence intervention team meeting.

Parent Drop-Off and Pick-Up: Front of the Middle School. This allows us to have proper security and supervision for students arriving and departing school.

Cell Phone Policy: ALL cell phones will be powered off and placed in the student's locker for the day. If you need to speak with your student during the school day, please contact the office at 937-593-9010.

For 6th grade students and new students to the building, there will be MANDATORY Chromebook

Device Meetings which will begin promptly at 4:00, 5:00, 6:00 or 7:00 in the BMS gym. In order for your student to receive a Chromebook when school starts a Parent/Legal Guardian must attend a meeting and sign the proper documentation.

- Pay school fees by visiting our awesome
 Secretaries in the office

IF for some reason you cannot attend this evening, there will be a make up date on Friday, September 2 at **8:00AM**. On Friday, September 2, you will only be able to pick up schedules and attend the mandatory Chromebook Device Meeting, Classrooms will not be available.

Chromebooks will be distributed to students on Tuesday, September 13, 2022 at school. In order for your student to receive a Chromebook, incoming 6th graders and new students to the district need to attend the mandatory meeting. Current 7th and 8th graders need to complete all needed documentation in Final Forms and at Open House.

You must complete student and parent Final Forms prior to the start of school, Tuesday, September 6, 2022.

Please NOTE: There is a \$30.00 school fee and \$50.00 technology fee. Fees can be paid online or at the school office.
